Toronto/ON – On Wednesday, June 25^{th,} 2008 The Canadian Hearing Society (CHS) will receive a \$12,000 donation from the Red Fridays Foundation of Canada (RFFC). The funds were raised through RFFC's successful Repatriation Memorial Drive on Saturday, May 31, 2008. The event hosted over 1000 cars, trucks, buses and motorcycles which rode from Trenton to Toronto along the Highway of Heroes to pay tribute to Canadian service men and women and veterans.

One of the aims of the program is to give veterans with a hearing loss the skills they need to stay safely and independently at home, improve communication with family and friends and help them to stay involved in their favourite activities.

"We are very excited to be able to present CHS with this donation on behalf of all the participants of our Rally and Memorial Drive," said Brian Muntz, RFFC Founder. "All of us who were involved with this event are so pleased to know that the money we raised will make a real difference in the lives of our veterans."
